1. Bringing History to Life (\$1000)

School: Helena High School **Teacher Recipient:** Kristen Lyndes

Sponsor: Student Assistance Foundation

Students in this special education program will document history and make connections with their personal histories using digital cameras, computers and movie software. The year long documentation of student, faculty and community life will culminate in a unique digital yearbook.

2. Bring on the Books (\$1,000)

Young students will have their own paperback books purchased with these funds to create weekly storytelling sessions in the evenings for pre-schoolers and parents. 4. Podcasting in Social Studies (\$994)

5. Building Brains and Brawn (\$3000)
