When the students are actively engaged in reading, their test skills will improve, naturally leading to higher test scores and an increase in reading confidence.

- Rossiter Elementary began the "Prints & Scrolls" project that brought local artist Phoebe Toland to every 4th grade classroom in the Helena School District to instruct students and teachers in the art of printmaking. Watch for their beautiful display at the Lewis and Clark library this spring!
- Students at Broadwater Elementary are tracking their good fitness habits with pedometers, while evaluating health related lifestyle behaviors and applying math skills to analyze and organize their data.
- Expansion of the Catty Shack is underway at Helena High, as students from the Small Business Management and Marketing classes continue their collaborative work to improve the school store.
- Jim Darcy Elementary students are "Discovering the World of Treasures" using Geomate geocaching GPS devices to experience how technology, the environment and community can inspire multiple learning opportunities as well as increase their understanding of geography.
- Capital High student reporters are integrating new technology to report on events as they happen and are devloping a paperless, online format. Their project is designed to use modern technology such as iPads and the Internet to extend the reach of the school newspaper to the digital generation it serves.
- Music students at C.R. Anderson Middle School have expanded their listening library to include 50 classical recordings that National Public Radio rates as essential for every classical music collection.
